

INDEPENDENCE DAY MESSAGE TO THE ARMED FORCES


As we observe the 191st birthday of our Nation on July 4, 1967. Americans are once again defending the unalienable rights of men to liberty and to a government of their own choosing.

Fang 8 Mik, Mr Ireland (R C) is now helping us out with our maintenance.



NEW FACES



AWARDS AND DECORATIONS







The second platoon has not been without a promotion this week. WO Gruetzmacher has made the jump from W1 to W2. Congradulations, Chief:




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LEMON AWARD

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
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
